Stephen Morillo began his career as a teacher and scholar of world history at Loyola when he taught the first semester of World History in the Fall of 1987. The challenges of teaching a topic with such vast scope immediately appealed to him, and he has gone on to a career of teaching and writing about various aspects of world history. The author of a just-completed textbook that approaches world history through the presentation of a visual-conceptual model of past societies and their connections and cultures, Morillo will talk about the changes in the field over the twenty four years since he first taught it, the challenges that face the field in the future, and the philosophical and conceptual approaches that may help advance the field through those challenges. In an ever-more globalized world, World History will play an increasingly important role making that world comprehensible and humane.
